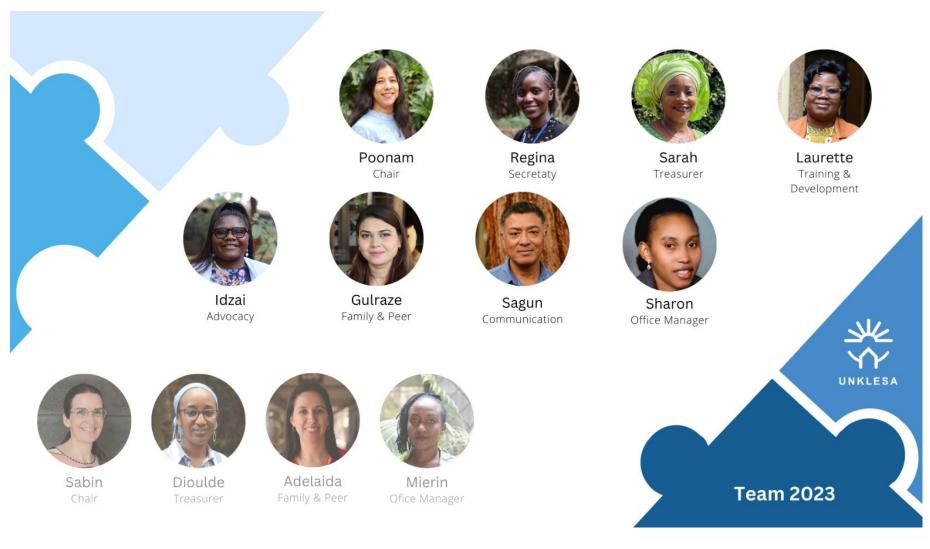

PROVISION FOR APPOINTMENT **UNKLESA** Constitution

Part 6 | Management of affairs article 16 | Vacancy, expulsion, suspension & resignation Section 1

In the event of a vacancy in the board where such vacancy occurs less than six (6) months before the next annual general meeting, such vacancy shall be filled at the discretion of the remaining board members and said vacancy may be made by appointment from among the regular membership. Should the vacancy occur more than six (6) months before the next Annual General Meeting, such vacancy shall be filled by a special election or special general meeting called for such purpose.



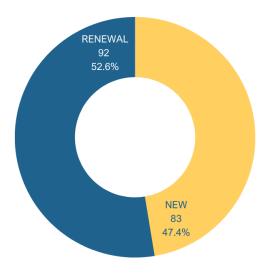




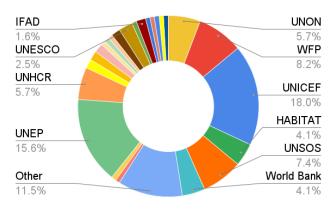


# 2023 MEMBERSHIP

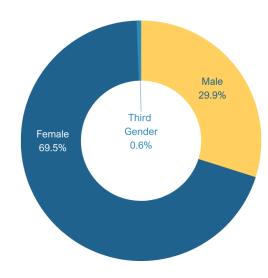

Enrollment 2023



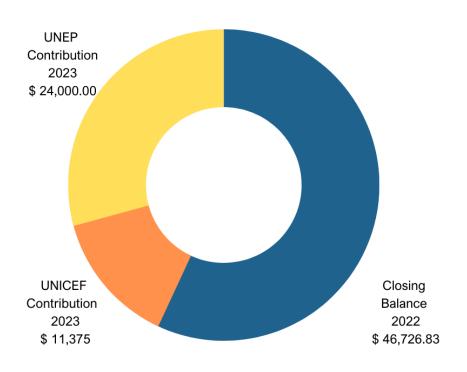
Membership by agency

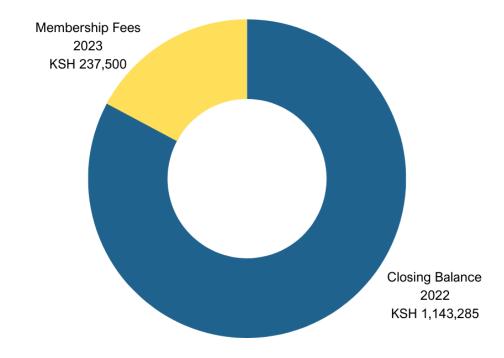


Membership by gender









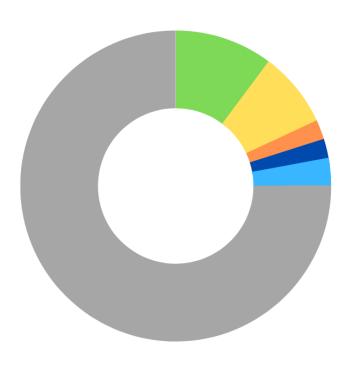

#### INCREASING UNKLESA VISIBILITY

Advocacy and networking focus lies on promoting UNKLESA among the UN Agencies and other organizations. In 2023 the building of collaboration with International Schools in Kenya was one of the major accomplishments.

The exercises carried forward for UNKLESA visibility are quarterly meetings with all the members and other new members about UNKLESA.

One of the main challenges we have faced for advocating on behalf of our members to get employment with UN agencies remain. However, breakthroughs have been made on the UNV & UNESCO front.

The Advocacy Working Group took many steps to reach out and build relations with many of the UN agencies, other LESAs, NHIF & NSSF, JMS and other agencies. Listed below are some of the steps taken achievements and engagements.

- Encourage UNKLESA members to update their profiles on the UNV portal. UNV positions are one of the ways to get into the UN system.
- Initiated the formation of the UNKLESA HR team and the agencies in discussion will support skill building.
- UNKLESA HR team will receive session training UNDP HR team.
- UNOPS will profile UNKLESA jobseekers to their staff members and share the job vacancies





- UNEP HR team will conduct training on how to fill the INSPIRA for our members and will share job vacancies UNKLESA members.
- Given the situation in Sudan, UNKLESA welcome spouses of UN staff members from Sudan who are based in Nairobi.
- UNKLESA managed to have new collaboration with UNDP, UN Visitors, UNOPS, UNICEF, UNEP and WFP
- Maintained the old collaborations
- In collaboration with other LESAs, specifically with NYLESA. helped with the collaboration of schools and with Embassies. This resulted in the increase of members from the Embassies.
- The weekly attending UNDSS presentation has increased the visibility of UNKLESA within the UNON community and the bigger UN community in Nairobi.
- UNKLESA Advocacy working group outreach to international schools in Kenya has taken root to have list of schools who have agreed to collaborate with UNKLESA. We now have several schools listed on the website, LINK. The idea behind the collaboration is to collect more detailed information on International Schools to make it available for our members. As we highlight the schools, we engage with the school to introduce our members with relevant backgrounds and make them aware we have a pool of talent among our members that brings related expertise to the school.





 We received testimonies from the schools and from UN staff members and UNKLESA members on how they have benefited from that information.

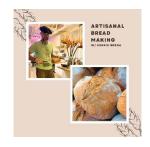






#### **COOKING WITHOUT BOARDERS**

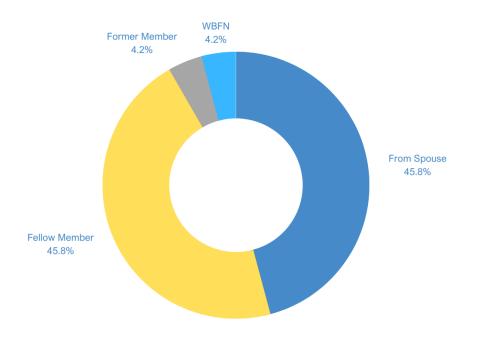




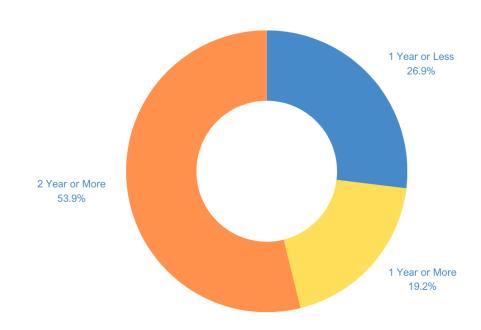




# MEMBER SURVEY FEED BACK Total of 26 members took the time to fill out the member survey form



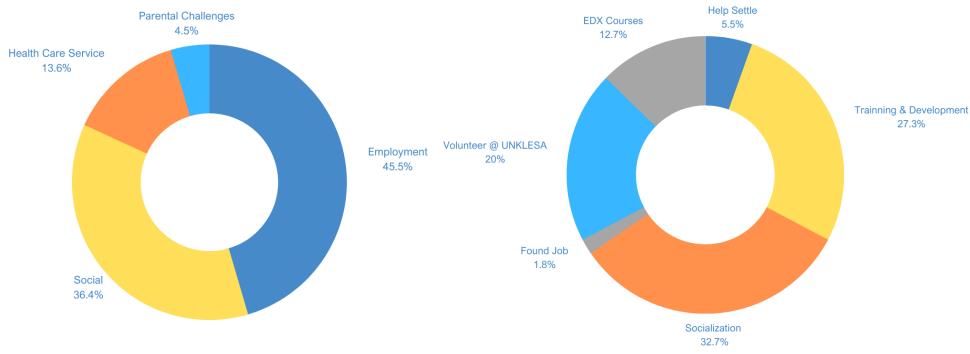
How did you learn about UNKLESA?



How long have you been a UNKLESA member?





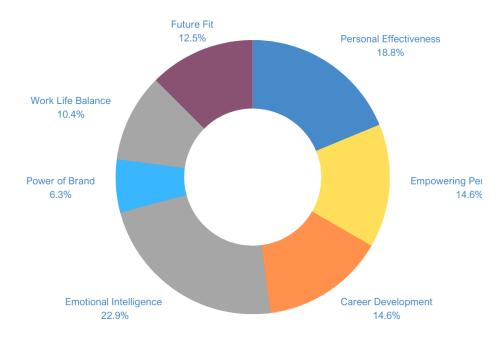


What challenges did you face settling in Kenya?
